Project Description

The UC Davis campus (the campus) proposes to construct and operate a conference center, a hotel, and a building for the Graduate School of Management on approximately five acres in the south entry area of the central campus. The proposed Conference Center, Hotel, and Graduate School of Management Building project site is in Yolo County and is located east of the Robert and Magrit Mondayi Center for the Performing Arts (currently under construction), north of the Union Pacific Railroad line, and south of Old Davis Road and the Department of Environmental Horticulture buildings and garden.

The conference center facility would be approximately 75,000 square feet and would include a restaurant, a pub, a 500-person capacity ballroom, meeting rooms, and office space for units in the Office of University Relations. The hotel would be approximately 40,000 square feet and would include 75 guestrooms. The Graduate School of Management Building would be approximately 45,000 square feet and would provide office space for the Graduate School of Management, units within the Office of University Relations, and the Internship and Career Center. The project would also establish open space and landscaping, and it would construct an approximately 100-space parking area. In addition, Department of Environmental Horticulture teaching and research field activities currently located on a portion of the project site would be relocated to the west campus on a parcel located north of Hutchison Drive near the University Airport. A greenhouse and an agricultural support building would be constructed on less than two acres at this new location.

Environmental Review and Comment

The University of California is the Lead Agency and has prepared a Draft Focused Tiered EIR (Draft EIR) for the proposed Conference Center Facility, Hotel, and Graduate School of Management Building project. Pursuant to Sections 15152 and 15168 (c) and (d) of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines, the environmental analysis in the Draft EIR is tiered under the programmatic 1994 Long Range Development Plan EIR (1994 LRDP EIR) (State Clearinghouse No. 94022005), as updated and revised by subsequent documents. Specifically, the 1994 LRDP EIR was updated and revised by the 1997 Wastewater Treatment Plant Replacement Project EIR (State Clearinghouse Nos. 95123027 and 96072024), the 1997-98 Major Capital Improvement Projects Supplemental Environmental Impact Report (State Clearinghouse No. 97122016), the Center for the Arts Performance Hall and South Entry Roadway and Parking Improvements Tiered Initial Study and Mitigated Negative Declaration (State Clearinghouse No. 98092016), the USDA Western Human Nutrition Research Center Tiered Initial Study and Mitigated Negative Declaration (State Clearinghouse No. 99092060), the Veterinary Medicine Laboratory and Equine Athletic Performance Laboratory Facilities EIR (State Clearinghouse No. 2000022057), and the Segundo Housing Improvement Projects Tiered Initial Study and Mitigated Negative Declaration (State Clearinghouse No. 2001092063). An appendix to the Draft EIR summarizes these changes.

UC Davis Conference Center, Hotel, and Graduate School of Management Building Draft Focused Tiered Environmental Impact Report

Proposed Project

The UC Davis campus (the campus) proposes to construct and operate a conference center facility, a hotel, and a building for the Graduate School of Management on approximately five acres in the south entry area of the central campus. The proposed Conference Center, Hotel, and Graduate School of Management Building project site is in Yolo County and is located east of the Robert and Margrit Mondavi Center for the Performing Arts (currently under construction), north of the Union Pacific Railroad line, and south of Old Davis Road and the Department of Environmental Horticulture buildings and garden.

The conference center facility would be approximately 75,000 square feet and would include a restaurant, a pub, a 500-person capacity ballroom, meeting rooms, and office space for units in the Office of University Relations. The hotel would be approximately 40,000 square feet and would include 75 guestrooms. The Graduate School of Management Building would be approximately 45,000 square feet and would provide office space for the Graduate School of Management, units within the Office of University Relations, and the Internship and Career Center. The project would also establish open space and landscaping, and it would construct an approximately 100-space parking area. In addition, Department of Environmental Horticulture teaching and research field activities currently located on a portion of the project site would be relocated to the west campus on a parcel located north of Hutchison Drive near the University Airport. A greenhouse and an agricultural support building would be constructed on less than two acres at this new location.

Project Objectives

The campus has identified the following objectives for the proposed Conference Center, Hotel, and Graduate School of Management Building project:

- provide a venue for state, national, and international academic conferences on the campus;
- provide an opportunity to host visitors, alumni, and the business community;
- add to UC Davis' role as a regional academic and arts center and meeting place in combination
 with the adjacent Center for the Performing Arts (currently under construction) and Buehler
 Alumni and Visitors Center;
- ensure that the conference center and hotel are financially viable operations;
- provide adequate space for future growth of the Graduate School of Management;
- provide access and exposure to the broader community for the conference center, hotel, and the Graduate School of Management;
- provide space for growth and consolidation of office space for a major portion of the Office of University Relations;
- consolidate Office of University Relations operations at a site that facilitates easy access by faculty, other campus groups, and external constituencies; and
- provide outdoor gathering areas and landscaped pedestrian walkways that link to adjacent uses including the Center for the Performing Arts and the Buehler Alumni and Visitors Center.

Environmental Review

In compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and the state and University of California guidelines for implementation of CEQA, a Draft Focused Tiered Environmental Impact Report (EIR) has been prepared that identifies and evaluates the environmental impacts of the proposed project.

The environmental analysis for the proposed project is tiered from the UC Davis 1994 LRDP EIR in accordance with Sections 15152 and 15168(c) of the CEQA Guidelines (Title 14, California Code of Regulations, Section 15000 et seq.) and Public Resources Code Section 21094. The environmental analysis is tiered from the 1994 LRDP EIR (State Clearinghouse No. 94022005), as updated and revised by a number of subsequent documents, including the: 1997 Wastewater Treatment Plant Replacement Project EIR (State Clearinghouse Nos. 95123027 and 96072024), the 1997-98 Major Capital Improvement Projects Supplemental Environmental Impact Report (State Clearinghouse No. 97122016), the Center for the Arts Performance Hall and South Entry Roadway and Parking Improvements Tiered Initial Study and Mitigated Negative Declaration (State Clearinghouse No. 98092016), the USDA Western Human Nutrition Research Center Tiered Initial Study and Mitigated Negative Declaration (State Clearinghouse No. 99092060), the Veterinary Medicine Laboratory and Equine Athletic Performance Laboratory Facilities Focused Tiered EIR (State Clearinghouse No. 2000022057), and the Segundo Housing Improvement Projects Tiered Initial Study and Mitigated Negative Declaration (State Clearinghouse No. 2001092063). These documents are available for review during normal operating hours at the UC Davis Office of Resource Management and Planning in 376 Mrak Hall on the UC Davis campus; at Reserves in Shields Library on the UC Davis campus; at the Yolo County Public Library, 315 E. 14th Street, Davis; at the Vacaville Public Library, 1020 Ulatis Drive, Vacaville; and online at http://www.ormp.ucdavis.edu/environreview/ (technical appendices are not available online). A document summarizing amendments to the 1994 LRDP and revisions to the 1994 LRDP EIR is also available online and is included as an appendix to the Conference Center, Hotel, and Graduate School of Management Building Draft EIR.

The 1994 LRDP EIR, as updated and revised, is a Program EIR, prepared pursuant to Section 15168 of the CEQA Guidelines (Title 14, California Code of Regulations, Sections 15000 et seq.). The 1994 LRDP EIR analyzed full implementation of uses and physical development proposed under the 1994 LRDP through the academic year 2005-06, and it identified measures to mitigate the significant adverse project and cumulative impacts associated with that growth.

In accordance with Sections 15152 and 15168(d) of the CEQA Guidelines and Public Resource Code Section 21094, the environmental analysis for the proposed Conference Center, Hotel, and Graduate School of Management Building incorporates by reference relevant information contained in the 1994 LRDP EIR. A Tiered Initial Study for the proposed project (published in August 2001) concluded that further analysis was required to more fully evaluate impacts in the resource areas of land use and planning, transportation and circulation, noise, and biological resources. For this reason, the campus prepared a Focused Tiered EIR for the project. Pursuant to Section 15161 of the CEQA Guidelines, the Draft Focused Tiered EIR for the proposed Conference Center, Hotel, and Graduate School of Management Building project is a Project EIR that examines the changes in the environment that would result from a specific development project. The project's Tiered Initial Study is included as Appendix A in the Draft Focused Tiered EIR.

Based on the analysis presented in the Draft Focused Tiered EIR, it has been determined that the project may incrementally contribute to, but would not exceed, certain significant impacts previously identified in the 1994 LDRP EIR. However, most of these impacts would be reduced to a level that is clearly less-than-significant through implementation of project-specific and 1994 LRDP EIR

mitigation measures.

The proposed project would contribute to traffic volumes that currently result in intersection level of service violations in the City of Davis, a significant and unavoidable impact. The proposed project may incrementally contribute to, but would not exceed, certain significant and unavoidable cumulative impacts previously identified in the 1994 LRDP EIR related to: intersection level of service, noise levels, criteria and toxic air emissions, exposure to existing hazardous materials during construction, hazardous materials use and waste generation, demand for emergency response, loss of ruderal/annual grassland habitat for wildlife species, construction effects on water quality, loss of ground water recharge potential, demand for water from the deep aquifer, seismic ground shaking, loss of cultural resources, loss of rural character, demand for fire protection and police protection services, and contribution of school age children to the Davis Joint Unified School District. Mitigation measures to reduce many of these significant and unavoidable cumulative impacts to less-than-significant levels are available but are not within the jurisdiction of the University of California to enforce and monitor. These significant and unavoidable impacts were adequately analyzed in the 1994 LRDP EIR (as revised) and fully addressed in the Findings and Statement of Overriding Considerations adopted by The Regents in connection with its approval of the 1994 LRDP and certification of the 1994 LRDP EIR.

Due to anticipated enrollment increases through 2014-15 that would exceed projections for growth through 2005-06 under the 1994 LRDP, the campus has closely examined each of the cumulative impacts identified in the 1994 LRDP EIR that could continue through 2014-15 (this evaluation is provided as Appendix D in the project's Draft EIR). Based on current preliminary knowledge regarding anticipated growth, the campus does not anticipate that growth through 2014-15 would create any new significant cumulative impacts in addition to those previously identified in the 1994 LRDP EIR, and the 1994 LRDP EIR is considered a valid basis for analysis of the cumulative environmental impacts of individual campus projects. However, a new LRDP EIR will fully evaluate the potential environmental impacts associated with the next LRDP.

Public Review and Comment

The public review period for the Conference Center, Hotel, and Graduate School of Management Building Draft Focused Tiered EIR will be from December 21, 2001 to February 4, 2002.
