


# *Relationship to Other Plans*



The 2003 LRDP provides broad parameters for organizing the growth and development of UC Davis. It is not an implementation plan and does not constitute a commitment to specific development projects, construction schedules or funding priorities. Each subsequent proposal for a new facility, or renovation of an existing facility, must be analyzed for consistency with the 2003 LRDP land use patterns and must be individually approved after appropriate review by The Regents or by the UC Office of the President, or the Chancellor's office as delegated by The Regents.

## **THE LRDP EIR**

This 2003 LRDP is accompanied by an Environmental Impact Report (EIR). The 2003 LRDP EIR is a comprehensive assessment of the potentially significant environmental effects of the implementation of the LRDP in its entirety, as required by the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA of 1970, as amended). The EIR is intended to inform university decision makers, the general public, the local community, and responsible and interested public agencies of the nature of the proposed 2003 LRDP. The 2003 LRDP EIR is also intended to enable The Regents of the University of California to consider the environmental consequences of the proposed 2003 LRDP when deciding whether to approve the proposed LRDP. The 2003 LRDP EIR will also be used as the basis for the environmental evaluation required by the CEQA for specific projects as they are proposed.

The 2003 LRDP EIR is a Program EIR. This Program EIR is appropriate because it assesses a series of actions that are part of one large project, the plan for campus growth through 2015-16.

## DISTRICT PLANNING GUIDES

District planning guides are more detailed site plans that are developed within the context of the LRDP. These guides are developed to give more detailed guidance for the siting of future buildings, roadways, pathways, and open spaces for distinct campus neighborhoods. These guides are constantly updated as specific project proposals take shape on the campus, and may be modified repeatedly before a specific project is implemented.



## SPECIFIC PROJECTS AND ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

The 2003 LRDP provides the context for individual project proposals as they occur on the campus. Each campus project proposal that has the potential to modify the physical environment will be the subject of project-specific environmental review. Project specific evaluation will be considered within the context of the 2003 LRDP EIR to determine the appropriate level of environmental review for each project. Each project proposal subsequent to the approval of the LRDP EIR must be approved individually, after appropriate review by The Regents and/or their designee, the UC Office of the President, or the Chancellor's Office at UC Davis.
